**Rules:** This is a sanctioned, non-qualifying competition under the rules of the 2009 US Figure Skating rulebook. Rules for the 2009-2010 competitive season will be used.

**Eligibility:** Skaters must be registered members of US Figure Skating and may compete at their test level or one higher as of April 23, 2009. **Ages are as of April 23, 2009.**

It is anticipated that the test session will begin Saturday morning, and events will continue through May 25.

**Facility:** The Coral Ridge Ice Arena is located in the Coral Ridge Mall, at 1451 Coral Ridge Avenue, Coralville, IA, 319-354-7870. The rink measures 200 ft by 85 ft.

**Entry form deadline:** All entries for the Hawkeye Skating Club Invitational Competition must be postmarked by April 23, 2009. The use of metered postage does not establish postmark, so only metered postage **received** by April 23, 2009 will be accepted as pre-deadline. Any application postmarked after April 23, 2009, or metered and received after April 23, 2009 will be considered a late entry. Late entries ARE accepted at the discretion of the competition committee and as well as the chief referee. A \$35 late fee will be charged. In the event of limits on the size of events, entries with earlier postmarks will receive priority. No refunds will be made after the deadline on April 23, 2009 unless the event is cancelled or closed due to a large number of entries.

### **Entry fees**

Basic skills: see Basic Skills entry form

Championship event: **Must be entered as first event.**

Pre-Juvenile (free skate only) \$80

Juvenile through Senior (combined short program and free skate) \$100

Any other first singles event: \$80

Each additional singles event: \$25

**Skaters are allowed and encouraged to enter both the Championship and separate Short Program and Free Skating events.**

Pairs: If the event is the skater's only event \$40/skater. If the event is a second event, \$25 for that skater.

Open pairs and ensembles: \$25/skater.

**All entries for pairs and ensembles must arrive together.**

An event will be held if at least two entries arrive. In the event of a single entry for an event, the skater will be contacted and offered the choice of a refund or skating for a critique. Events may be combined at the chief referee's discretion. Due to ice time limitations the chief referee reserves the right to cancel events or limit entries to those with the earliest postmark, with suitable advance notice and refund of entry fees.

There is a \$35 charge for returned checks.

**ENTRY FEES MUST ACCOMPANY EACH APPLICATION.** Checks should be made payable to Hawkeye Skating Club.

**Groups:** A large number of entries in some events will be divided into groups as follows: Beginner through Juvenile and Open Juvenile will be grouped by birth date. Intermediate through Senior events and Championship events will be grouped by random draw. Beginner through Open Juvenile; Free Skate, Compulsory Moves and all Spins, Jumps, Duets, and Trios, and Artistic events with insufficient entries at a particular level may combine groups of male and female and entrants will be judged together.

**No refunds will be provided after April 23, 2009.** If you must scratch one or more events, please notify the competition committee or registration desk.

**Registration desk:** There will be a registration desk at the rink. The registration desk will be open 1 hour prior to the competition on each day and will remain open throughout the competition. **Skaters must check in 1 hour prior to their event.**

**Practice Ice:** Skaters may reserve up to three practice ice sessions in advance. A practice ice form is included with this announcement. Attempts are made to keep sessions separate by skating level.

**Additional Practice Ice:** Check at the registration desk upon arrival for additional practice ice sessions. Sessions will be sold on first-come, first-serve basis. Coaches, parents, and skaters may purchase ice time for one skater at a time, except for members of the same family. No phone calls will be accepted to purchase additional practice ice.

**No music will be permitted on practice ice.**

Planned program content sheets should be filed electronically through the U. S. Figure Skating website for all IJS events ([www.usfs.org](http://www.usfs.org)). A \$25 fee will be charged for sending a paper planned program content sheet. Content sheets filed electronically must be done so by May 1, 2009 at 10pm. If not filing electronically, send paper content sheet with \$25 fee enclosed, to registrar postmarked no later than May 15, 2009.

**Notices:** Prior to the event notices will be posted at [www.hawkeyeskating.org](http://www.hawkeyeskating.org) During the competition information will be posted on a bulletin board at the Coral Ridge Ice Arena. Posting on this bulletin board will be considered sufficient notice for all competitors.

**Awards:** All Limited No-Test, No-Test, and Pre-Preliminary event skaters will receive an award for participation. In other events, awards will be presented to at least the top five skaters in each event. Awards will also be presented to the top five skaters for the combined short and long programs in the initial rounds of Championship events. Award

recipients are encouraged to participate in the awards presentation and photography regardless of placement.

**Music:** Music will be played from CDs only. The CD must contain only the selection for the event. Music must be clearly marked with the skater's name, event, group, and correct playing time in minutes and seconds. Skaters must have a backup copy of their music at rink side during the event. Music may be picked up from the registration desk within an hour of the completion of the skater's event. The Hawkeye Skating Club cannot accept responsibility for unclaimed music.

### **Photography and video services**

Photography services will be provided. Video services will be available if entries permit. You will be notified of services with mailed schedule. If you will be videotaping, please be considerate and do not block the view of spectators. Use of rink power outlets is not permitted.

Championship Free Skate events will be offered at the Pre-Juvenile, Juvenile, Intermediate, Novice, Junior and Senior level. Juvenile through Senior Championship Events are a combined event consisting of the Short and Long Program. The Pre-Juvenile Championship Event is a Free Skate. Should entries call for an initial round, it will include both the Short and Long Program; the final round will include only the Long Program. The number of skaters moving from initial rounds to the championship round will be posted at the competition. Skaters are allowed to enter both the Championship events and separate Short Program and Free Skate events.

## PAIR EVENTS

Pair Free Skate events will be offered at the Pre-Juvenile, Juvenile, and Intermediate. The Pair Event is a combined event consisting of the Short and Long Program for Novice, Junior and Senior levels. Test requirements apply to both partners. Program requirements are based on the current US Figure Skating Rulebook for the 2008-2009 season as per 4000-4091. Pairs may compete at one level higher than their test level.

## ARTISTIC EVENTS

6.0 Judging used for all Artistic events

Eligibility is the same as those for Free Skating events. Skaters may select their own music (with or without words). The artistic event allows the skater to demonstrate their music interpretation skills. Jumps are allowed, however judging will not be based on skating difficulty. Props may be used if they can be placed and removed by the skater in 30 seconds, and do not present a danger to the skater. NOTE: PROPS WILL NOT BE ALLOWED ON PRACTICE ICE. Separation of levels will be determined by the number of entrants. Program times are +/-10 seconds.

Eligibility is the same as for Free Skating events. Compulsory Moves are skated without music. The specified moves may be in any order but must be skated exactly. An Axel is a single jump. Connecting steps must be distinguishable from a footwork sequence. Juvenile free skaters may enter **either** the Juvenile/Open Juvenile Compulsory Moves Event **or** the Juvenile Short Program, but not both. Limited Beginner through Pre-Juvenile and Open Pre-Juvenile Compulsory Moves events with insufficient entries at a particular level may be combined and male and female entrants judged together.

**Limited Beginner through Pre-Juvenile/Open Pre-Juvenile will utilize half the ice surface.  
Juvenile/Open Juvenile will utilize the full ice surface.**

### **OPEN PAIRS AND ENSEMBLE EVENTS**

A fun event open to any two to six skaters who want to present a pair or ensemble program. No restrictions as to gender, age, or skating level. The music selection can be any style, with or without vocals. No lifts are permitted. The judges will be looking for good unison and original choreography. Skaters will be divided into Pairs and Ensembles. 1.5 minutes to 2 minutes.

## SPIN EVENTS

### 6.0 Judging used for all Spin events

## JUMP EVENTS

6.0 Judging used for all Jump events

Entrants will qualify according to their Free Skate level. Beginner through Juvenile and Adult Pre-Bronze through Silver levels will be skated on half-ice. Intermediate through Senior levels and Adult Gold will be skated on full ice. Jumps should be performed **exactly** as stated. Skaters will be given two opportunities to perform each jump and will be judged on the best one. **Each skater will perform all of her/his jumps in sequence.** For example, if the two jumps to be performed are the double flip and the double loop, Skater #1 will take the ice individually and be given two attempts at the double flip. Skater #1 will then be given two attempts for the double loop. The process will then be repeated for Skater #2, and the rest of the skaters. An axel will be considered a single jump. In situations where the skater is given the choice of the jumps to be performed, the first attempt will determine the jumps to be judged and the skater will not be allowed to change jumps on the second attempt.

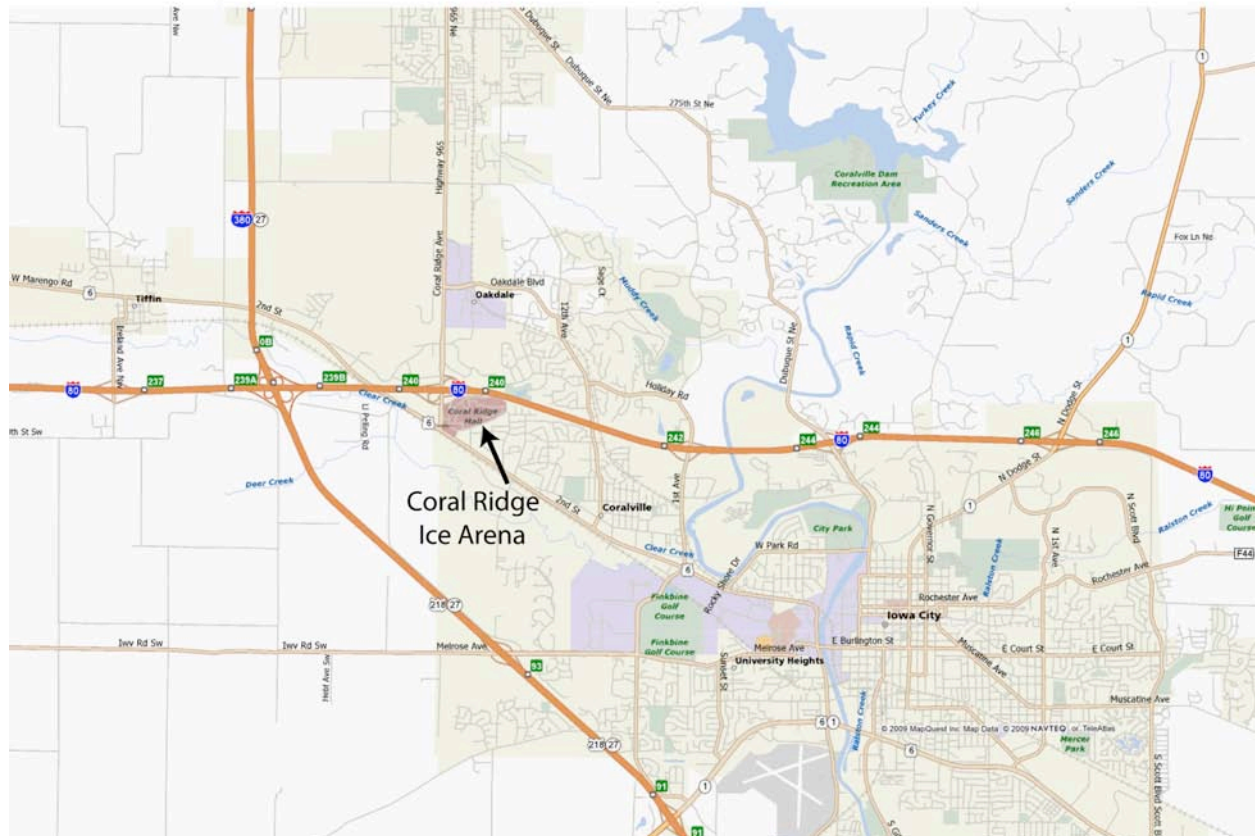
